REPORT ON CANCER AWARENESS RUN

A Cancer Awareness Run and Cancer Awareness Program was organized by Shillong Commerce College in collaboration with Manbha Foundation, Tata Trust and supported by the Department of Surgical Oncology, NEIGRIHMS on the 13th March 2018. The route for the run was from Shillong Commerce College to Khyndai Lad (Police Bazaar) and back. The run was flagged off by the Principal of the college Shri J.B.Massar and Dr. Zulfikar Hazarika, ENT Surgeon, Bethany Hospital at 6:30am. There were around 300 who participated in the run which included Doctors from NEIGRIHMS, Students, Teachers, general public, CRPF personnel, etc. There were about 500 who attended the Awareness programme.

The event was a part of 'Run and Ride Against Cancer', organized by Tata Trusts and Cachar Cancer Hospital which covered several cities of the North East to spread cancer awareness in the region. The Run was followed by an Awareness Program which was graced by Shri Pravin Bakshi, IAS, Secretary, Health Department, Government of Meghalaya as the Chief Guest. He spoke of the various efforts of the government in halting the spread of non-communicable diseases and how tobacco-related diseases not only harm the individual, but also negatively impacts the economy of the state. Dr. Caleb Harris, HOD I/c Surgical Oncology, NEIGRIHMS, stressed that Shunning of tobacco, alcohol and betel nut (kwai) can reduce the cancer burden in Meghalaya, and Dr. R. Ravi Kannan, Director, Cachar Cancer Hospital exhorted everyone to fight against tobacco use and administered a pledge against tobacco. A Cancer Survivor shared his testimony about how he was cured of cancer after being treated at NEIGRIHMS.



The program was chaired by Associate Prof. Shri. D. Sawkmie and Dr. Rica Lamar, Secretary, Manbha Foundation gave the vote of thanks.

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At the end of the Awareness program, bikers (Silchar Thumpers Enfield Club) were flagged off by the Chief Guest for their onward journey to Guwahati for the next leg of their pan North-East Awareness Program.

PARENT-TEACHER MEET

Shillong Commerce College Shillong June 23, 2018

The meeting was opened by Mr Dominick Sawkmie, Associate Professor of the Department of Economics, who was also the Chairperson of the Meeting. Mr Sawkmie welcomed all the parents for attending the meeting because this interaction would help the college in meeting the needs of the students. He further mentioned that being a father himself, he realised that Shillong Commerce College is one outstanding college which would organise such meetings frequently in order to enable the college and its faculty to give their best to the students.

The Principal of the college, Mr J M Massar, delivered the welcome address. The Principal thanked especially the parents who made an effort to attend the meeting because, according to him, this gesture on their part indicated that they really cared for their children. He mentioned about the sad situation that some parents do not care for their children. Ironically, they love their children but do not care about them. This is the attitude that is not good. In this college, according to him, 70 percent of the students do not have fathers. In such a situation, mothers or the guardians were expected to attend such meetings to communicate to the college about the difficulties that their children are going through. The college would like to know about the behaviour of the children at home. "Are they responsible? Are they serious with their studies?" These are some of the concerns that should not be taken for granted. As a matter of fact, in this day and age, it is very difficult to raise up children. The easy access to social media is a threat to the children's welfare. This complicated situation has necessitated the Principal to be more sensitive towards the students that he has become their 'father' in the college. His door is always opened to them and in the course of time he has learned so much especially from the students who are regular absentees. Discipline is an essence of the college. Absentism of three days in a row, according to the rule of the college, makes it mandatory for students to meet the Principal with proper explanation for absentism though provision of a medical certificate is not essential. This meeting was essential for parents especially to interact openly with the college authorities and faculty. The Principal also informed the parents about the provision of extra teaching on GST, Tally and a plan for a Certificate Course on Tourism in order to help students be employable. The college has proudly produced many successful professionals including the Registrar General of the High Court, Lawyers, Meghalaya Civil Services Officers, Probationary Officers, Professors and Lecturers to name a few. Parents were also informed about the daily availability of free medical treatment provided by a doctor and a nurse. Apart from this, the college provides Mentoring and a Counsellor is specially employed to cater to the students' psychological needs. The holistic development of the students is the concern of the college and therefore awareness programmes on relevant issues are also being held on a regular basis. The Principal concluded his speech by encouraging parents to communicate with him or the faculty regarding any issue related to their children or to write a complaint and put it in the complaint box because according to him, "In the college we have no power but we can influence life".

The next speaker was Mr Shanbor Kharmawphlang, Parents' Representative and IQAC member of Shillong Commerce College. Mr Kharmawphlang felt that this meeting was organised at the right time because this was the time when the sessions started. To him, as well as other parents, it is a privilege to have children study in this college because, as the Principal had mentioned that, the college provides not only educational qualifications but is also concerned about the welfare of the children and the community at large.

Parents appreciated the college management for organising this meeting and appreciated the faculty for meeting the intellectual needs of their children. They also spoke about their concern for their respective children when it comes to attendance and discipline. Another parent suggested that college students should not be treated as children but as adults to enable them to be responsible and mature human beings

Mr D M Syiem wrapped up the meeting by requesting the parents to co-operate with the teachers by encouraging their children to study on a regular basis and not only for passing the examination so that there will be overall development in the professional life of the students.

Dr (Mrs) Sen, the Vice-Principal of the college delivered the vote of thanks with the concluding remarks: "To speak gratitude is courteous and pleasant, to enact gratitude is generous and noble, to live gratitude is to touch heaven".

REPORT ON STUDY TOUR TO KOLKATA

3rd JULY TO 9th JULY 2018

The Principal Sir Shri J.B. Massar had selected 21 students with good percentage from both boys and girls and two escorts Mrs Regina Mawrie and Mr Jerry Mawrie for the study tour to Metro City, Kolkata.

There were 15 girls and 6 Boys. We started the trip from Shillong on the 3rd of July 2018 at 6:30 AM from Don Bosco Square, Shillong by 3 tourist Sumos. We stop at Nongpoh for breakfast wherein we reached Guwahati Railway Station at 11 AM. The departure time for Howrah by Saraighat was 12:30 PM. We all rushed to platform No.2 and got in train No. 12345 S1 in which the students were instructed to checked their seat numbers to settle down and relax. We reached Howrah Railway Station the next morning that is on the 4th July 2018 around 5:30 AM. A bus from Meghalaya House Kolkata was arranged to picked us up from the railway Station and we reached Meghalaya House at around 6:30AM. We went straight to the reception Counter to enquire the rooms which were pre-booked by the Principal wherein the staff showed the students to their rooms. After we were all freshen up, we took the students for lunch in the canteen of Meghalaya House itself. After lunch we had arranged a bus that took us to Science City. The students got to see the different types of Aquariums and were also guided to the Planetarium , Humanity Space, Science Exploration Hall, etc. We came out of Science City through Rope Way. On the same day in the evening we asked the bus driver to drop us to New Market for some shopping and returned back to Meghalaya House at 10:30 PM.

On the 5th July , we had arranged a bus to Sundarban Tiger Reserve at 5:30 AM. On reaching Sundarbana at 11:30 we had lunch before proceeding further and then a Guide took us by steamers to the Tiger National Park where we felt cool breezes and sounds of nature. The Sundarban spreads over 10,000 sq m surrounded on both sides of the rivers by beautiful forest which sheltered monkeys, crocodiles, turtles, birds and the famous Bengal Tigers. The boat stopped at Tiger National Park and we all got down and walked around the Park where we saw huge lizards, snakes, crocodiles, etc. We came out of the park at around 5 PM and we reached Meghalaya House around 11 PM.

On the 6th of July, we had again arranged a bus for the trip to Mandar Moni Beach (Digha Beach) at 5 AM. It was a 5 hours journey from Kolkata Kosba and we reached the beach at 10:30 AM. There we all had a great time. The students swam and played with the waves, played hand ball, clicked snaps and had the time of their lives. We return back at around 4:30 PM and reached Meghalaya House at about 10 PM.

On the 7th of July we took the students to Aquatica by the Bus arranged from Meghalaya House, Kosba. There students enjoyed playing the different types of rides in the water kingdom

and thereafter we had our lunch and then the bus took us to Acropolis Mall for 1 hour for shopping and then we again took the students for shopping at New Market. We took the students to Sree Leather where students enjoyed purchasing leathered goods like suitcase, bags, shoes, belts etc. We had dinner and then we called the bus driver to pick us up from the market at 9.30 P.M . We reached Meghalaya House at 10.40 P.M and instructed the students to do their packing during night time so that no work is left behind in the morning.

On the 8th of July we woke up in the morning and got ready to go back to our home town Shillong. At 8.30 P.M we all came out from the rooms, went and pay all the dues at the reception of Meghalaya House Kosba and we had our Breakfast then at 10 A.M sharp we got into the bus where we took the students to Mother Teresa House in Lingh Road, we dropped in and saw Mother Teresa's Tomb, her rooms, museum and Church. Students were very happy they got to visit her place. We then came out from there again we got into the bus and took the students to Victoria Memorial we went into the park, click some snaps and within half an hour we came back to the bus again then we proceed to Howrah Railway Station, and we reached there at 12.45 P.M. Our Departure time was 3.45 P.M. then we took all the students to the waiting room and we break for lunch then after that we relax for one hour, and at 2.30 P.M we started from waiting room and hurriedly rushed to platform no 9 where only 45 minutes left with us to reach there. Our train is Saraighat and the train No is 12346 S2. We had a tuff time reaching S2 but somehow managed to get into the train on time where we again instructed the students to search for their own seat nos. After finding our seats, exactly at 3.45 P.M the train departed from Howrah To Guwahati. We had snacks and dinner and the students played and sang songs.

On the 9th of July 2018 we reached Guwahati at 10.15 A.M ,we went straight to the bus station and finally we got one small bus and we started from there around 11 A.M and had our lunch and tea at Nongpoh. Finally, we reached Shillong at 3 P.M. where all students were pick up by their own parents and relatives.

Venue: Conference Hall, Shillong Commerce College Organized by the IQAC, Shillong Commerce College

The "University Grants Commission (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations 2015" describes the responsibilities of higher educational institutions in taking measures for prevention of sexual harassment at the workplace. UGC Regulations are statutory in nature, and hence all universities and colleges are bound by it. With this objective in mind the college had organized this programme to educate the participants not only about the challenges that women faced in the workplace but what discrimination and harassment is, explains legal definitions, discusses prevention, shows how to handle complaints and how to create a healthy environment for oneself. The Programme was attended by students and Teacher, both male and female.

Session:1

ISSUES DISCRIMINATION AND CHALLENGES FACED BY WOMEN IN THE WORK PLACE WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO LEGAL REDRESSAL

Resource Person: Smti. A. M Pariat, Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, Government of Meghalaya

There are several issues and problems that women face today. Sometimes, they are not treated equally in their workplace and are considered as inferior to their male co-workers and in some cases they do not get the same benefits as that of a male employee. The major issues and problems that women face at their work place includes unequal pay, security, sexual harassment, lack of proper family support, deficient maternity leave, etc. However, there is a difference between bullying and harassment and the phenomenon is not country specific but universal. Workplace bullying is gender agnostic (non-believer) and can be perpetrated by both male and even a female boss. Sexual harassment in workplace is a serious factor that renders women's involvement in work place unsafe and affects right to work with dignity.

National Commission for Women Act, 1990 (Act of Parliament): Creates a National Commission for Women to review existing statutory protection of women; prepare periodic reports to the Central Government on matters relating to safeguards for women's rights; investigate complaints relating to the deprivation of these rights; and financially assist in the litigation of issues affecting women. Therefore all the rights of women have to be respected, protected and fulfilled, be it right to property, right to health, education and life with dignity. The law and order has to look into these crimes specifically and effectively curb them with an iron hand. Lack of safety prevents women from fully participating in the public life. Thus

providing safety or finding solutions also need to be observed within a framework of rights. Only then can women access the full range of rights of being a true citizen.



Activity 3:






TOTAL NUMBER OF CADETS PRESENT: 06 SW



VOLUNTARY BLOOD DONATION


DATE: 19TH JUNE 2018




OBSERVANCE OF WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY
